OPERATION MANUAL

Dear SHARP customer

Thank you for your purchase of the SHARP LCD colour TV product. To ensure safety and many years of trouble-free operation of your product, please read the Important Safety Precautions carefully before using this product.

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Precautions for daily use

Observe the following items

Maintenance of the cabinet

- When cleaning the cabinet, use a soft cloth (made of cotton, floss, etc.) to clean gently.
- Do not use a dry or damp rag mixed with chemicals, as this could cause the ingredients of the cabinet body to deteriorate or crack.
- Be careful not to use an abrasive cloth for cleaning or clean with excessive force, as this could scratch the surface of the cabinet.
- If the cabinet is greatly soiled, clean with a soft cloth (made of cotton, floss, etc.) soaked with a small amount of diluted neutral detergent and wrung out, and then clean with a soft dry cloth.
- Because the cabinet is made of plastic, solvents such as benzene, alcohol or thinner could cause it to deteriorate, or make its coating come off. Therefore do not use such solvents to clean the cabinet.
- Because plasticizer is included in the plastics, deterioration or the coating peeling off could occur when the cabinet comes into
 contact with some substances. Therefore keep it away from volatile substances such as insecticide. In addition, do not let it come
 into contact with objects made of rubber, resin, etc. for a long time.

Maintenance of the LCD panel

- Before cleaning the LCD panel, be sure to turn off the TV set and unplug the power cord from the outlet.
- When cleaning the LCD panel, use a dry and soft cloth (made of cotton, floss, etc.) to clean the surface of the LCD panel gently. For
 protecting the LCD panel, do not clean with a dirty cloth, detergent, or a dry or damp rag mixed with chemicals, as this could cause
 peeling of the panel surface.
- · Be careful not to clean with an abrasive cloth or with excessive force, as this could cause the panel surface to be scratched.
- If the LCD panel is greatly soiled, clean it gently with a soft cloth (made of cotton, floss, etc.) soaked with a small amount of water (Do not clean with excessive force, so as to avoid the scratch of the panel surface).
- If dust sticks on the surface of the LCD panel, clean the panel with a commercially available cleaning brush (anti-static brush).

Important safety precautions

Cleaning — Unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet before cleaning the product. Use a damp cloth to clean the product. Do not use alcohol cleaners, spray cleaners or chemical cloth when cleaning because these types of materials may damage the product.



 Water and moisture — Do not use the product near water, such as bathtub, washbasin, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool and in a wet basement.



 Do not place vases or any other water-filled containers on this product. Do not place the product under air conditioner, humidifier and so on. The water may spill onto the product causing fire or electric shock.



 Stand — Do not place the product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod or table. Doing so can cause the product to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the product. Use only a cart, stand, tripod, bracket or table recommended by the manufacturer or sold with the product. When mounting the product on a wall, be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions. Use only the mounting hardware recommended by the manufacturer.



 When relocating the product placed on a cart, it must be moved with utmost care.
 Sudden stops, excessive force and uneven floor surface can cause the product to fall from the cart.



• Ventilation — The vents and other openings in the cabinet are designed for ventilation. Do not cover or block these vents and openings since insufficient ventilation can cause overheating and/or shorten the life of the product. Do not place the product on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface, since they can block ventilation openings. This product is not designed for built-in installation; do not place the product in an enclosed place such as a bookcase or rack, unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions are followed.



 In case the product is dropped and the cabinet is damaged, be sure to turn off the power of the product, and unplug the power cord. If you continue to use the product, it may cause fire or electric shock.



 Do not open the rear cover of the cabinet to reconstruct the circuits. There exists high voltage within the cabinet and it may cause electric shock and injury. If maintenance is required, contact your dealer.



 The LCD panel used in this product is made of glass. Therefore, it can break when the product is struck forcefully or with a sharp object. If the LCD panel is broken, be careful not to be injured by broken glass.



 Heat sources — Keep the product away from heat sources such as radiators, heaters, stoves and other heat-generating products (including amplifiers)



 To prevent fire, never place any type of candle or naked flames on the top or near the TV set.



 To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not place the AC power cord under the TV set or other heavy items.



 Do not place heavy objects on this product or stand on it. Doing so could cause injury if the product overturns. Take special care near children and pets.





 Unplug the power cord before you move the TV set. If not unplugged beforehand, the power cord may become damaged and cause electric shock.




The LCD panel is a very high technology product with 8,294,400 pixels, giving you fine picture details.

This is within product specifications and does not constitute a fault.

Precautions when transporting the TV





Be sure to always carry the TV by at least two people holding it with two hands — one hand on each side of the TV.

- Do not display a still picture for a long time, as this could cause an afterimage to remain.
- Install the product on the place where the AC cord can be unplugged easily from the AC outlet.



Make sure the following accessories are provided with the product.




Attaching the stand unit

- When you attach the stand unit, put the TV on a flat surface.
- Before attaching (or detaching) the stand unit, unplug the AC power cord from the AC power outlet.
- Before performing work, spread cushioning over the surface on which you will be laying the TV. This will prevent it from being damaged.
- Attach the stand unit in the correct direction.
- . Be sure to follow the instructions. Incorrect installation of the stand unit may result in the TV falling over.


Place the TV on a flat surface with soft cushion on top of it. Insert the stand unit into the slot on the bottom of the TV while holding the stand unit to avoid it falling over.

Insert the four screws into the four holes on the back of the TV, and tighten them.



NOTE

- When installing the stand unit, you need to put your TV on a flat surface. Before that, put a soft cushion on the surface.
- To detach the stand unit, perform the steps in reverse order.
- The angle of the stand unit is not adjustable.
- A screwdriver is not supplied with this product.
- During installation, please be careful to avoid getting your hand trapped between the TV bottom and the floor.



Handling and precautions with the wall-mounted TV

- You can mount the TV on the wall using the optional bracket.
- For details, refer to the instructions supplied with the optional bracket.

CAUTION

- This TV should be mounted on a wall only with a wall mount bracket recommended by SHARP. The use of other wall mount brackets may result in an unstable installation and may cause serious injuries.
- Installing the TV requires special skills that should only be performed by qualified service personnel. Customers should not attempt to do the work themselves. SHARP bears no responsibility for improper mounting or mounting that results in accident or injury.

Using a SHARP recommended bracket to mount the TV


- You can ask a qualified service professional about using a SHARP recommended bracket to mount the TV to the wall.






Before turning on the power

Notes on installing the TV

- Avoid direct sunlight and place the TV in a well-ventilated location.
- Place the TV in a level location.
- Do not turn on the power of the TV before connecting the AC cord.
- If there are any protective plastic sheets on the TV cabinet, please take them off before connecting.

Connecting the antenna cable


To enjoy a clearer picture, use an outdoor antenna. The following is a brief explanation of the types of connections that are used for coaxial cable.


Plug the AC cord in to the AC outlet.



- Place the TV close to the AC outlet, and keep the power plug within reach.
- Disconnect the AC cord from the AC outlet if the TV will not be used for a long period of time.

4 Bundling the cables

As the picture illustrated, insert the cable clip into the hole on the TV, and put the cable into the cable clip for banding.



@|CAUTION

• To prevent risk of electric shock, do not touch un-insulated parts of any cables with the AC cord connected.


Connecting external devices

You can connect many types of external equipment to your TV, like a VCR, Digital TV Set Top Box (STB), game console, camcorder, DVD player and PC. To view external source images, select the input source from \bigoplus on the remote control unit or **INPUT** on the TV.

(M) CAUTION

- To protect all equipment, always turn off the TV before connecting to a VCR, game console, camcorder, DVD player, Digital TV Set Top Box (STB), PC or other external equipment.
- Refer to the relevant operation manual (Digital TV Set Top Box (STB), VCR, DVD player, etc.) carefully before making connections







Inserting a SD/SDHC memory card (commercially available)

It provides access to Apps ,video,music,and other files in SD/SDHC memory cards. Insert a SD/SDHC memory card that stores your files into the SD slot. Refer to the method of playing files stored in the USB device specified on page 29 for details.



⊘ NOTE

- Insert the memory card into the slot in the direction shown in the figure.
- The SD slot supports SD and SDHC memory cards. However some memory cards may not be supported.
- This product supports memory cards with a maximum storage of 32 GB. We recommend that you use a memory card with at least a speed of Class 4 for a higher read-write speed, thus guaranteeing the system performance.
- Unplug the memory card after you have safely unloaded it or the TV has been turned off.
- Do not unplug the memory card while data is being transferred. Otherwise the TV may malfunction.
- Regularly back up data in the memory card to prevent data corruption or operating errors of the TV. (SHARP shall not bear any responsibility for data corruption or destruction.)

Inserting the batteries

Before using the TV for the first time, insert two "AAA" size carbon batteries (supplied). When the batteries become depleted and the remote control fails to operate, replace the batteries with new "AAA" size carbon batteries.

1 Open the battery cover.



- **2** Insert the two supplied "AAA" size carbon batteries.
- e **3** Close the battery cover.



 Place batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications in the battery compartment.



(CAUTION)


Improper use of batteries can result in chemical leakage or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Do not mix batteries of different types. Different types of batteries have different characteristics.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries or cause chemical leakage in old batteries.
- Remove batteries as soon as they have worn out. Chemicals that leak from batteries can cause a rash. If you find any chemical leakage, wipe thoroughly with a cloth.
- The batteries supplied with this product may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions.
- If you will not be using the remote control unit for an extended period of time, remove the batteries from it.
- Batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

Using the remote control unit


Use the remote control unit by pointing it towards the remote sensor window.

Objects between the remote control unit and sensor window may prevent proper operation.




Cautions regarding the remote control unit

- Do not subject the remote control unit to shock. In addition, do not soak the remote control unit with liquids or place it in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control unit under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the unit.
- The remote control unit may not work properly if the remote sensor window of the TV is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such cases, change the angle of the lighting or TV, or operate the remote control unit closer to the remote sensor window.



Turning the TV on/off



Running the TV for the first time

After inserting the AC cord, press POWER on the TV.

- The power indicator turns green. TV is switched on (After several seconds, an image appears with sound.)
- You can switch the TV to standby by pressing POWER on the remote control.

Turning off the TV

If the TV is switched on, press **POWER** on the remote control:

- TV is switched into standby and the image disappeared.
- The power indicator turns to red from green. Press POWER on the remote control to turn on the TV.
- If pull out the AC cord and then plug it, the power indicator turns to red. Press **POWER** on the remote control to turn it on.

If the TV is switched on, press **POWER** on the TV:

- TV is turned off.
- The power indicator turns off. You can't turn on the TV by pressing POWER on the remote control.
- If you pull out the AC cord and then plug it, the power indicator turns to red. You can press **POWER** on the remote control to turn it on.

Power indicator

| Off | Power off |

⊘NOTE

- If you are not going to use this TV for a long period of time, be sure to remove the AC cord from the AC outlet.
- A small amount of electric power is still consumed even the TV is in standby mode or switch off by pressing **POWER** on the TV.
- If TV loses power in special circumstances (such as power outage or grid fluctuations, etc.), TV may not work well when TV is switched on again. Please try to power off the TV (by the **POWER** key in the TV's body) or unplug and replug the AC cord to restart the TV.
- It is a normal phenomenon when the TV temperature rises in the process of watching TV.
- Please do not cut the power off casually in the process of switching on or switching off the TV, running APPS or updating, otherwise TV system could not work rightly. Please turn off TV after closing all APPS.

User Guide

When the TV powers on for the first time after purchase, the setting wizard appears. Follow the menus and make the necessary settings one after another.

Confirm the following before turning on the power

- Is the antenna cable connected?
- Is the AC cord plugged in?

Press POWER on the TV.

- It displays the boot screen, and then "Language Setting" appears.
- It may cost a little time when TV is switched on for the first time. Please wait patiently.



Language Setting

- When the screen displays "Language Setting", press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "繁體中文","简体中文" or "EN", and then press **ENTER**.
- If you want to exit User Guide, press

 ▲/▼/◀/▶ on the remote control to select
 "Exit", and then press ENTER.

Start Settings

- When the screen displays "Start Settings", press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "Next" and then press ENTER.
- If you want to return to "Language Setting", press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "Back", and then press **ENTER**.

Mode Setting

- When the screen displays "Mode Setting", press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "Home" or "Store", and then press **ENTER**.
 - Please select "Home" when you watch TV at home. "Store" is only for retail store displays.
 - "STORE": "DYNAMIC (Fixed)" will be the default value for the "AV mode" setting. If the "AV mode" is changed, the TV will automatically switch back to "DYNAMIC (Fixed)" when there is no further change to TV setting for 10 minutes.
 - "HOME": "STANDARD" will be the default value for the "AV mode" setting.

TV Channels Setting

- When the screen displays "TV Channels Setting", press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "Start" and then press **ENTER**.
 - The TV searches for sorts and stores all the receivable TV stations according to their settings and the connected antenna.
 - To abort the initial channel in progress, press
 ◄/▶ on the remote control to select "Pause", and
 then press ENTER. Press ◄/▶ on the remote
 control to select "Resume" to continue previous
 scan, and then press ENTER.
 - If you select "Skip" and press **ENTER**, TV will skip "TV Channels Setting" into "Network Setting".
 - After the search, It appears "Scanned TV Channels".
- After the search, press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "Next", and then press ENTER into "Network Setting".

 If you want to return to "Mode Setting", press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "Back",

and then press ENTER.

Network Setting

- When the screen displays "Network Setting", press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "Ethernet" or "Wi-Fi" to connect the network.
 - Ethernet includes "Auto" and "Manual". Please see page 26.
 - If you want to return to "TV Channels Setting", press ◀/▶ on the remote control to select "Back", and then press ENTER.
- Press ▲/▼ on the remote control to select "Finish", and then press **ENTER**.

You can set your TV as you desired by pressing **MENU**.

General

For general setting.



Wallpaper setting

You can change the wallpaper of smart home.

- In the "Menu", press ▲/▼ to select "General", and then press **ENTER**.
- Press ▲/▼ to select "Wallpaper setting", and then press ENTER.
- Press **◄/▶** to select "Starry Sky" or "Diamond Shine", and then press **ENTER**.

Skin setting

You can change the skin of smart home.

- In the "Menu", press ▲/▼ to select "General", and then press **ENTER**.
- Press ▲/▼ to select "Skin setting", and then press ENTER.
- Press ◀/▶ to select "Colour Surge" or "Minty Fresh", and then press **ENTER**.

Booting state

You can set booting state.

- In the "Menu", press ▲/▼ to select "General", and then press **ENTER**.
- Press ▲/▼ to select "Booting state".
- Press ◀/▶ to select "TV" or "Smart home".

 "TV": When turn on the TV, It displays TV mode.

 "Smart home": When turn on the TV, it displays the smart home.

Language

You can select a language from the menu.

Select from among 3 languages: English, 繁體中文, 簡體中文.

In the "Menu", press ▲/▼ to select "General", and then press **ENTER**.

- Press ▲/▼ to select "Language".
- Press **◄/▶** to select desired language listed on the screen.

NOTE

 Only after restarted the TV, the language of the system can be changed.

Default input method

For setting input method.

- In the "Menu", press ▲/▼ to select "General", and then press ENTER.
- Press ▲/▼ to select "IME setting", and then press ENTER.
- Depending on your preferences, press ▲/▼ to select desired input method listed on the screen, and then press ENTER. Press RETURN to save and exit.

NOTE

- The initial installation of the TV is "IQQI-Chinese Pro".
- If you use any other input method, SHARP can not guarantee its compatibility with television system.

No signal power off

You can set the TV to automatically power off in about 15 minutes after the TV goes into a state of receiving no programme signals.

- In the "Menu", press ▲/▼ to select "General", and then press **ENTER**.
- Press ▲/▼ to select "No signal power off".

Sleep timer

Auto power-off at a designated time.

- In the "Menu", press ▲/▼ to select "General", and then press ENTER.
- Press ▲/▼ to select "Sleep timer".
- Press **◄/**▶ to select "Off", "30min.", "60min.", "90min.", "120min." or "150min.". Or you can press the **SLEEP** on the remote control unit to select.

NOTE

- When the time has been set, countdown automatically starts.
- Five minutes before the preset of time expires, the remaining time displays each minute.

Video

Set the video as you desired .



AV mode

The "AV mode" function enables you to select appropriate settings for audio and video to account for the system environment.

- In the "Menu", press ▲/▼ to select "Video", and then press **ENTER**.
- Press ▲/▼ to select "AV mode".
- Press **◄/**▶ to select you want. Or you can press the **AV MODE** on the remote control unit.



EPG

An "EPG" (Electronic Programme Guide) is a programme schedule, which is displayed on the TV screen. The EPG is broadcasted together with DTV. The TV screen shows the EPG when the viewer presses **EPG** on the remote control, provided that the TV is receiving the digital broadcasting signal. The EPG enables you to check the schedule of DTV, view detailed information, turn to an event currently on-air and set a timer for future events.



- Press **EPG** to display EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) screen.

 - The programme of the selected channel displays.

The guide for EPG is displayed on the bottom of TV screen, The operation for the relative colour key is as follows:







- If the TV connects with USB-HUB, the TV may not be able to recognise all USB memory device.

Troubleshooting

The problems described below are not always caused by malfunctions. Check the TV again before having the TV serviced.

| Problem | Possible solution |

| No power. | Is the AC cord disconnected? (See page 12.) Has the power been turned on? (See page 16.) When the power switch does not work, remove the power plug and insert it again, and press POWER on the TV after waiting more than five seconds. |
| Unit cannot be operated. | External influences such as lightning, static electricity, etc., may cause improper operation. In this case, operate the unit after first turning the power off or unplugging the AC cord and re-plugging it in after 1 or 2 minutes. |
| Remote control unit does not operate. | Are batteries inserted with polarity (+, -) aligned? (See page 15.) Are batteries worn out? (Replace with new batteries.) Are you using it under strong or fluorescent lighting? Is a fluorescent light shining on the remote control sensor? |
| Picture is cut off. | Are screen mode adjustments such as picture size made correctly? (See pages 19 and 20.) |
| Strange colour, light colour, or dark, or colour misalignment. | Adjust the picture tint. (See page 19.) Is the room too bright? The picture may look dark in a room that is too bright. Check the colour system setting. (See pages 22 and 23.) |
| Power is suddenly turned off. | The unit's internal temperature has increased. Remove any objects blocking the vent or clean. Is the sleep timer, no signal power off? (See page 18.) |
| No picture. | Is the connection to external equipment correct? (See pages 13, 14 and 29.) Is the correct input selected? (See pages 10, 11, and 27.) Is the picture adjustment correct? (See page 19.) Is the antenna connected properly? (See page 12.) |
| No sound. | Is the volume too low? (See page 11.)Make sure that headphones are not connected. (See page 10.) |
| The TV sometimes makes a cracking noise. | This is not a malfunction. This happens when the cabinet slightly expands and contracts according to changes in temperature. This does not affect the TV's performance. |
| Cannot select the desired channel. | Switch between Digital TV and Analogue TV modes. (See page 11.) |
| Cannot connect to the Network | Is the LAN cable connected correct. (See pages 25 and 26.) Check the "LAN setting". |

Cautions regarding use in high and low temperature environments

- When the unit is used in a low temperature space (e.g. room, office), the picture may leave trails or appear slightly delayed. This is not a malfunction, and the unit will recover when the temperature returns to normal.
- Do not leave the unit in a hot or cold location. Also, do not leave the unit in a location exposed to direct sunlight or near a
 heater, as this may cause the cabinet to deform and the LCD panel to malfunction.
 Storage temperature: -20°C to +60°C.






